

Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you.

⁴ You have a few names even in Sardis who have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with Me in white, for they are worthy. ⁵ He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.




BACKGROUND ON SARDIS

- Very well-established city, considered among <u>oldest in</u> world. 60 miles inland from Ephesus.
- "Heyday" 6th century BC, capital of kingdom of Lydia.
 Glorious city, mentioned in many Greek writings.
- Built on mountain top, <u>extremely well fortified</u> on hill 1000 feet above valley.
- Seemed to defy any kind of military assault, <u>appeared</u> impregnable.

- False sense of security here, people believed they were safe when they were not (so did this church!).
- Stories of how King Cyrus of Persia eventually took Sardis, well known in this city.
- Commander of Cyrus' army told his soldiers there was great reward for anyone who could figure out how to successfully attack this great mountain stronghold.
 <u>Appeared</u> impossible.

- However, one soldier watching Sardis guards on top of mountain saw one <u>accidentally drop his</u> <u>helmet over side</u>, watched as soldier picked his way down the mountain and back up again to retrieve his helmet.
- Continual erosion of cliffs had left large cracks which could be maneuvered, now exposed by soldier watching.



- Persian soldier told his commander. That night Persian army climbed so-called "unassaultable" mountain same way soldier had seen guard do it.
- When they got to the top, no one there! No guards.
- Guards <u>assumed no one could climb their way to the top</u>.
 They didn't think they needed to guard it.
- Did not think they even needed to watch for the enemy.

WRONG!

- Sardis taken, not just this time, but several times after as well.
 Sardis fell on multiple occasions with <u>surprise attacks same way</u>.
- Didn't learn from own history.
 "WATCH!" = key word for Sardis.
 World knew of her mistakes.
- When letter written to Sardis, everyone aware of this, understood letter's command about being watchful.



 Great trading center, like Thyatira, center for woolen goods, dyeing industry (also like Laodicea).



- Sardis had <u>river very rich in gold</u> <u>deposits</u>. Modern money, minted gold and silver coins, born in Sardis.
- Roman "assize" town, where justice was dispensed, plenty of Roman pomp and circumstance.
- Would liked to have been center for Caesar worship, but lost bid to Smyrna.


- Very involved worship of Cybele (son was fabled Midas, the one who had "gold" touch) with frenzied rites involving sexual immorality and mutilation.
- Because no Caesar worship, Sardis was not a particularly dangerous place for Christians, at least not physically dangerous.


A far greater problem here for the "Church..."

- 17 AD huge earthquake hit area, devastated Sardis.
- Romans poured lots of manpower/money into rebuilding this ancient city, but <u>former glory was gone</u>.
- Now Sardis known as a center for moral decadence.
- Even rest of pagan world considered Sardis notorious for loose living, pleasure seeking, and luxury loving (sound familiar?)
- Life far too easy here. Incredible wealth, no persecution.

- Spiritually deadly condition **COMPLACENCY**. One commentator said this: "<u>The Church at Sardis was at peace, but it was the peace of the dead</u>."
- Sardis can literally mean "that which remains" or "remnant."
- After earthquake devastated region, city of Sardis remained, but merely a <u>remnant</u> of its former self.

- Also true for church here.
- Sardis known as the unwatchful, "sleeping" church in which only a remnant of true believers remained.
- Then...and NOW.





• "Seven Spirits" may refer to Isaiah 11:2 (CJB)

The Spirit of *ADONAI* will rest on him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and power, the Spirit of knowledge and fearing *ADONAI* —

- However, some disagree. "Seven" = symbolic for perfectly complete. Wholeness and <u>fullness of Holy Spirit with this</u> <u>Speaker. Fully God</u>.
- Seven Spirits of God = idiom for Holy Spirit. Speaker is "fully God," in their midst, knows everything about them.


Will see reference to Seven Spirits a bit later too...

And from the throne proceeded lightnings, thunderings, and voices. Seven lamps of fire were burning before the throne, which are the <u>seven Spirits of God</u>. (4:5)

And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne and of the four living creatures, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as though it had been slain, <u>having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the **seven Spirits of God** sent out into all the earth. (5:6)</u>

"...the seven stars..."

- Explained in 1:20: "The mystery of the seven stars which you saw in My right hand, and the seven golden lampstands: The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands which you saw are the seven churches."
- "Angel" (Greek) literally messenger. May be human messengers (pastors, "shepherds" of flocks) or heavenly messengers assigned to churches.



CRITICISM (What they didn't do well)

"...that you have a <u>name</u> that you are alive, but you are dead."

- "Name" = onoma used several times here. Means having a certain reputation, being called something that describes you.
- Reputation of being "alive" but <u>spiritually dead inside</u>.
- Church at Sardis, and entire city, had <u>reputation for immorality</u>
 and loose living. Wore a label "Christian" and were called by that
 name, but apparently were not living their faith.

COMMENDATION

(What they did well)

"I know your works..."

(but none are listed!)

NONE!

This church in serious trouble.
 One of two letters with no commendation.



² Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die, for I have not found your works perfect before God.


EXHORTATION (What they NEED to do)

- (1) "Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain,"
- Slap in the face for complacent Christians in Sardis. Were being lulled to "sleep." Christians in name only. Very thin ice here.
- Like Persian soldier watching and waiting for way to attack, enemy also watching and waiting to attack.
 Already had. Almost lost faith.

 "Works" inadequate. Doesn't mean they didn't do enough good works.

Their <u>lives</u> were not living testaments of their faith (book of James).

- If they didn't wake up, work on what remained (the grace of God, their flickering faith, some attempts to live to please God), it would die forever.
- "the things which remain" = deliberate pun on meaning of Sardis = "that which remains" or "remnant."



EXHORTATION (What they NEED to do)

- (2) Just like Ephesus, reminded to **remember first love**, think back to when they first believed, **hold fast**.
- Holding fast here = continuous action. Don't let go for a minute, keep holding.
- AND, repent of spiritual stupor, become watchful and alive again.
- Unlike church at Ephesus, this church apparently had no redeeming qualities. Sank into worldly ways of this city.

3 ...Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you.

- Using city's reputation of being unwatchful, Yeshua warns if they don't wake up and watch for His coming, they just might miss it.
- Once more in this book Jesus references **coming as a thief**: Revelation 16:15 "Behold, I am <u>coming as a thief</u>. Blessed is he who watches, and keeps his garments, lest he walk naked and they see his shame." **KILL COMPLACENCY!!**
- Thief generally unexpected, results in unpleasant surprise. Will be <u>most unpleasant of all surprises</u> if we are not watchful and ready.

 Concept of Jesus' coming as a thief reinforced multiple times in NT:


Matthew 24:33 But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into.

Luke 12:39 But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into.


1 Thessalonians 5:2 For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night.

- 1 Thessalonians 5:4 But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you <u>as a thief</u>.
- 2 Peter 3:10 But the day of the Lord will come <u>as a thief in the night</u>, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up.

COMMENTARY: Winston Churchill said to Britain in the early days of World War II: "I must drop one word of caution, for next to cowardice and treachery, overconfidence leading to neglect and slothfulness, is the worst of wartime crimes." (We are in a war for our souls!)



- Apparently "a few" (sorry state!) in Sardis who had not "soiled" their garments. Indicates faithfulness, holy living.
- Don't misunderstand "they are worthy." None of us worthy in our own strength.
- Only way these people could become "worthy" = by continuing daily walk with Jesus, relying on power of Holy Spirit. They had maintained their relationship with Him.
 Others had not.
- "Even in Sardis..." indicates Jesus knows corrupt conditions in Sardis and despite this, some have held fast.




⁵ He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels.

PROMISE

- Mention again of <u>white garments</u>, <u>symbol of</u> <u>righteousness</u> (<u>redeemed</u>), given us by Jesus. <u>Living like</u> <u>rest of world will defile and soil our robes</u>.
- Here overcomer promised white garment, <u>one not soiled</u>. We (and they) <u>receive incorruption of Jesus</u>.
- Also reference to pagan worship. Considered sacrilege to approach "the gods" in stained/soiled clothing. Sardis Christians in danger of approaching the One True God in soiled robes. Rich lesson = read Zechariah 3

3:1 Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of YHVH, and Satan standing at his right hand to oppose him. ² And YHVH said to Satan, "YHVH rebuke you, Satan! YHVH who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you! Is this not a brand plucked from the fire?"

³ Now Joshua was clothed with filthy garments, and was standing before the Angel.



All glory to him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by shedding his blood for us.

⁴ Then He answered and spoke to those who stood before Him, saying, "Take away the filthy garments from him." 

- **Book of Life:** All cities in that day kept <u>registers of its</u> <u>citizens</u>. When they died, names "blotted out." (More on Book of Life later in Revelation. Guess how many references there are in Revelation to the Book of Life?)
- Book of Life is God's registry of heaven. God writes every name here, but some will be blotted out ("second death," separation from God).
- "I will confess his name..." Roll call of truly alive in Jesus (not like almost-dead in Sardis!) called by Jesus Himself before the Father.


- Our "genealogy" either the family of Adam, which is to death, or the family of Jesus (the Lamb's Book of Life) which is one of eternal life. (Subset of Book of Life)
- Only way to keep from being blotted out is to live in Yeshua our Messiah.





- Again, mandate to "hear" what Spirit says to churches comes <u>after</u> promise to believer.
- Thought: starting with age of church at Thyatira (dark ages), perhaps perverted mixed organized church of Christianity + paganism = beyond point of repentance. (Organized church, for the most part, has not returned to pure Word. Religion vs Relationship. Like unrepentant Jezebel)
- But never too late for individuals to repent and return.

- Church at Sardis thought to prophetically represent the Reformation and start of the protestant denominational church, 1600-1750 AD) in an historical timeline.
- Church at beginning of this era woke up out its spiritual sleep and reminded Christians of original great truths (justification by faith alone, inerrancy of the Word of God, depravity of man, etc.) of the Word of God.
- However, with denominationalism, those truths were once again in danger of being lost.
